

Golf Course Synopses

Pine Beach East

- East was built in the 1920s and has a park-like atmosphere with mature oaks, birch and pines
- East was designed by James Dalglish, a British designer
- East is exceptionally well manicured and has quick, true greens
- East is a very fun, challenging golf course for all abilities
- East features 27 sand bunkers, water on 4 holes and a waterfall on the 9th green
- East has the only par 6 hole in the state, it's 618 yards and normally plays into the wind
- East is a traditional length resort golf course – 6100 yards
- East slope is 113 for men and 122 for women (Slope is a measure of the difficulty of the golf course)

Pine Beach West

- West is a beautiful, scenic golf course
- West is rolling wooded terrain
- West features some of the best greens in the area
- West will bring out every club in your bag
- West is most popular with the local golfers
- West is a great warm up round or finishing round for the Classic and can be played in 3 -3 ½ hours
- West is a great length for seniors and families
- West is dotted with numerous flowerbeds and features grass bunkers and only 1 sand bunker
- West is just over 5000 yards long and has a slope of 104 for men and 110 for women

The Classic

- The crown jewel of golf in the Brainerd Lakes Area, a “True test of golf”
- Opened in 1997, designed by Scott Hoffman, Madden's golf course superintendent
- Received numerous awards and national recognition: Ranked 33rd best public golf course in America by Golf Digest (2003). Rated 5 stars by Golf Digest (2007 & 2009)
- Breathtaking elevation changes, and views of tree lined fairways, lakes, waterfalls, marshlands, perfectly manicured turf
- Over 50 sand bunkers with “Ohio's Best” white sand and water on 16 of 18 holes
- 6 sets of tees, which allows players of all skill levels of play and enjoy the course
- The Classic ranges from 4859 yards forward tees to 7102 yards back tees, and has a slope of 143 men and 124 women
